



Dice cricket is a fun and exciting version of cricket. All you need to play is an opponent, a dice and this sheet. During the first innings player one bats and player two bowls. The batting side rolls the dice. A 1, 2, 3, 4 or 6 scores runs and is added to the 'runs scored' column of the first batter. The batter continues to roll the dice and score runs. However, if the batter rolls a 5 it is an appeal for a wicket.

When there is an appeal the bowler rolls the dice. When the bowler rolls the dice the numbers are:

1. Caught behind
2. Run out
3. Leg before wicket
4. Caught
5. Bowled
6. Not out

When the first batter is dismissed, the next batter begins to score runs. Player one continues batting until all eleven of their batters have been dismissed. The second innings then begins with player two batting.
